The meeting began with The Pledge of Allegiance and a moment of silence.

Special Guest Luigi Palleschi, ABD Builders, described a previously approved project for condos/apts. on Hudson Ave. He requested an extension for the project. It was determined the paperwork may have been dropped to the Town offices instead of the Village office for review. The Mayor was going to investigate. If not located, Luigi will deliver another group of drawings to the Village. The Board decided they were not prepared for any action at this time.

American Legion Post 490 representatives Kevin Flanagan and Ed Burmaster explained the construction would be starting soon for the new Legion building and wanted to discuss water/sewer connections.

MOTION to waive the water and sewer connection tapping fees for the American Legion Post 490, American Legion Way, for their new construction building made by Mayor Wood-Shaw, seconded by Trustee Zeno

June 14th the American Legion will be celebrating Flag Day, with a groundbreaking ceremony for their new building at 5:00 pm and Flag Day ceremony to follow, that all board members and staff are invited to.

CORRESPONDENCE – Thank you note received from the Village Clerk thanking the Board and employees for the dish garden in memory of her mother in law Annette Tedesco.

FIRE DEPARTMENT CHIEF: There were 7 alarms and 3 drills during the month and all members had their annual physicals.

DPW – Matt R. stated the crew flushed hydrants, replaced some water shut offs, hung the flags and banners and did general spring maintenance. The chlorine pump has been replaced at the Dick Lynch water tank and started chlorine injections at the sewer plant on May 1.

BCO – Absent

Report summarized - There were 8 permits issued during the month and one OTR. An inspection has been completed of Major Dickinson Park and it has been well maintained.

ENGINEERING – Ed H. reviewed monthly reports and stated there are not any compliance issues, but the flows of both the water and sewer are still higher than average. An RFP was prepared for a firehouse study. The annual MS4 report and Colonial Road plans for development were reviewed.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Trustee Basile stated Skip's Electric has completed the upgrades to the Firehouse Building. He has been conducting a street lighting survey to consider switching to LED's. He suggested all Trustees take a ride at night to survey the streetlights for needs/wants throughout the Village. He stated he believes there should be a streetlight at each intersection and there are a few lacking at this point. He gave a brief summary of pricing of gas vs. electric for a car, while explaining the thoughts of going all electric in the near future, based on a presentation he recently attended. An RFP was distributed last week for the firehouse. He met with the auditor to schedule an audit during the next fiscal year.

Trustee Campbell stated there is a trade in dump truck that he is waiting for a call on to inspect at HL Gage for \$39,990. The DPW will assist.

Mayor Wood-Shaw stated Trustee DeMarco and her daughter planted all the flowers around the Village and they look beautiful.

RESOLUTION FOR BLACK TOPPING BASKETBALL COURTS FOR PROJECT BACKBOARD

Motion By: Trustee DeMarco Seconded By: Trustee Basile

The purpose of this resolution is to enter into a contract for resurfacing the asphalt basketball courts at the American Legion/Village Park as part of Project Backboard.

WHEREAS, the surface of the present courts has deteriorated to require paving of a new surface to effect a satisfactory playing surface and,

WHEREAS, the Village has received proposals from four blacktopping firms and,

WHEREAS, the proposals have included three methods of installing new blacktop and,

WHEREAS, four proposals recommended removing all of the present blacktop by others and upgrading the underlayment before the proposed new blacktop would be installed and,

WHEREAS, this first method was considered to have greater risk and overall cost because of the general wetness of the surrounding grounds and prospect of a significant additional stone subbase fill so this method was rejected and,

WHEREAS, a second method with three proposals to apply a new final surface over the existing asphalt after filling the existing cracks is being rejected due to concern with fusion of the new and old may not last and,

WHEREAS, a third method with two proposals to mill off approximately two inches of the existing surface, filling the remaining cracks and applying the new asphalt surface would avoid the risks of the first and second methods and now.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Village Board accepts the third method as its choice of resurfacing the subject basketball courts and now,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor be authorized to negotiate and enter into a contract with either Evolution Construction Services or Capital District Services, their proposals being essentially equal for an amount not to exceed \$29,000.00.
