Mayor Martin called the meeting to order at 7:00 P.M. and led the pledge to the flag.

Reports given for Sept. & Oct. 2012. There were 4 alarms and 4 drills in the month of October.

SUPERINTENDENT OF DPW: Robert Gerasia

The hydrants have been flushed, there were new water and sewer taps installed for 44A Colonial Road. The crew has been working on leaf pick up throughout the month. He purchased a new box for the pickup truck that was previously damaged and has deteriorated over the years to the point of needing replacement. Water and sewer have been installed at Clinton Court and they will begin to pave on Monday. A manhole has been installed at Russell Drive and we will be replacing the one on Stratton Lane.

BLDG. CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICER: Lynn Goman

Report given for October and November 2012. There were (2) building permits issued, (1) certificate of compliance, (2) notices of violations & (2) inspections. He had meetings with two village residents that are contemplating work that will require set back variances. He suggested they both come to a board meeting to discuss their issues. He has attended (4) classes for In-Service training to maintain his certification for next year, he has 21 of 24 hours required.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Trustee Basile stated there is a meeting with the USDA on Monday Nov. 26th, 2012 for them to perform a final review of the Water Project. He stated last Wednesday was interesting because there were 5 work locations on Hudson Ave. with 3 contractors working and a subcontractor working:, it was a lot of work being done at one time in the Village of Stillwater. The Insituform work being done, with their technology, will extend the sewer life by another 30 to 50 years for the village.

Trustee Collins no report other than to state the budget for the water fund looks to be in decent shape for the expense side and the billing side.

Trustee Vomacka stated the sidewalk project is moving along and hopes to get some answers for Mr. Warneburg's questions. One of the cameras for the basketball courts was defective and has been sent back for replacement.

Village resident, James Champlin asked if there were any permits issued or discussions with the new owner in reference to the property known as Stillwater Landing? Not yet, per Mayor Martin. There is activity going on there. Trustee Basile asked if Mr. Champlin saw any construction. Mr. Champlin stated he just spoke to an engineer. Trustee Basile thanked Mr. Champlin for the observation. Mr. Champlin stated there is a story on the website in regard to the sidewalk funding that is misleading. Mayor Martin stated the drainage portion of the project is to be funded by the taxpayers and the sidewalk portion will be reimbursed to us by NYSDOT. Mr. Champlin asked what is the total cost to the taxpayers? Mayor Martin stated we do not know the exact cost as of yet. Mr. Champlin asked if the minutes from the special meeting on 5/10/12 could be posted on the website, along with the annual quality water report. Mr. Champlin also inquired into the status of the GE and Gene Cook lawsuits. Mayor Martin stated there have not been any recent updates. Mr. Champlin also asked if there were any plans for the property at the water treatment plant and when was it officially shut down. Per Mayor Martin the plant was officially shut down March 15th and there are not any plans for the property at this time. Mr. Champlin also stated there is a barrel mailbox blocking most of the sidewalk on Hudson Ave.
