Proposed Local Law #2 of 2020 was discussed and the following was determined.

The proposed zoning amendment modifies Table 1 Schedule of Uses to include "LIMITED AGRICULTURAL USE" as a permitted use in all Transect Zones. The amendment further defines "LIMITED AGRICULTURAL USE" under Article X as "Land may be used for the raising of hens with no more than 1 hen per 800 square feet of open lot space. Hens must not be kept in high density cages and shall be contained to a fenced area with adequate space to roam. Roosters are prohibited. Fruit and vegetable gardens permitted."

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board will hold a public hearing on the proposed Local Law No. 2 of 2020 and environmental review thereof on July 21, 2020; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Village Mayor and Clerk are directed to prepare such notice, publication and referral as required by law, including Village Law 7-706 and General Municipal Law 239-m.

Bond Resolution Dated June 16, 2020

A Resolution Authorizing Improvements to the Village of Stillwater Hillside Tank Water Supply Line and Related or Incidental Thereto, and Authorizing the Issuance of Serial Bonds of the Village of Stillwater in an Aggregate Principal Amount Not to Exceed \$1,222,364 Pursuant to the Local Finance Law to Finance Said Purpose and Delegating the power to Issue Bond Anticipation Notes in Anticipation of the Sale of Such Bonds to the Village Treasurer.

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Stillwater, New York (the "Village") (by the favorable vote of not less than Two-Thirds of all the members of the Board) as follows:

Section 1. The specific object or purpose (herein referred to as "purpose") to be financed pursuant to this Resolution is the construction and installation of improvements to the Village water distribution system, including, but not limited to, replacement and installation of a new water supply line, and the acquisition of equipment, machinery or apparatus. The estimated maximum cost of said purpose is \$1,222,364.

Section 2. The Board of Trustees plans to finance the total cost of said purpose by the issuance of serial bonds of the Village in an amount not to exceed \$1,222,364, hereby authorized to be issued therefore pursuant to the Local Finance Law, through a combination of (i) an approximately \$733,418 New York State Water Infrastructure Improvement Grant (the "WIAA Grant") which has been awarded the Village to pay a portion of the cost of the Purpose and (ii) debt financing by the issuance of its serial bonds.

Section 3. It is hereby determined that said purpose is an object or purpose described in subdivision 1. of paragraph (a) of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law, and that the period of probable usefulness of said purpose is 40 years.

Section 4. It is hereby determined that the proposed maturity of the obligations authorized by this Resolution will be in excess of five years.

Section 5. Current funds are not required to be provided prior to the issuance of the bonds authorized by this Resolution or any notes issued in anticipation of such bonds by virtue of paragraph 9 of subsection d. of Section 107.00 of the Local Finance Law, with respect to all objects and purposes authorized to be financed hereby.

Section 6. The faith and credit of said Village are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same respectively become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds becoming due and payable in such year. There shall annually be levied on all the taxable real property of said Village a tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same become due and payable.

Section 7. Subject to the terms and contents of this Resolution and the Local Finance Law, and pursuant to the provisions of Sections 30.00, 50.00, and 56.00, of said Law, the power to authorize bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance of the serial bonds authorized by this Resolution and the renewals of said notes and the power to prescribe the terms, form and content, and the manner of execution of the same, of said serial bonds, and said bond anticipation notes, including the consolidation with other issues, and also the availability to issue bonds with substantially level or declining annual debt service, and the power to sell and deliver said serial bonds and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the issuance of such bonds, is hereby delegated to the Village Treasurer, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the Village.

Such bonds and bond anticipation notes shall contain substantially the recital of validity clause provided for in Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law, and shall otherwise be in such form and contain such recitals, in addition to those required by Section 51.00 of the Local Finance Law, as the Village Treasurer shall determine consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 8. The Village Treasurer is further authorized to take such actions and execute such documents as may be necessary to ensure the continued status of the interest on the bonds authorized by this Resolution, and any notes issued in anticipation thereof, as excludable from gross income for federal income tax purposes pursuant to Section 103 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code") and to designate the bonds authorized by this Resolution, and any notes issued in anticipation thereof, as "qualified tax-exempt obligations" in accordance with Section 265(b)(3) of the Code.

Section 9. Pending the sale of bonds herein authorized, the temporary use of funds from the Village's general fund, pursuant to the provisions of Section 165.10 of the New York Local Finance Law, is hereby authorized. The Village reasonably expects to reimburse itself from the proceeds of

bonds or notes herein authorized for expenditures made for the purpose to be financed by this Resolution prior to the issuance of such bonds or notes, and this Resolution is intended to constitute a declaration of "official intent" to reimburse for the purposes of U.S. Treasury § 1.150-2.

Section 10. The Village has determined that the purpose described in Section 1 of this Resolution is a Type II action (under 6 NYCRR 617.5(c)(2)&(5)) which will not have a significant effect on the environment and, therefore, no other determination or procedures under the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQR") is required.

Section 11. The validity of said serial bonds or of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said serial bonds may be contested only if:

- (1) Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said Village is not authorized to expend money, or
- (2) The provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of this resolution , or a summary thereof, are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commended within twenty (20) days after the date of such publication, or
- (3) Such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution of New York.

Section 12. The Village Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to publish this resolution, or a summary thereof, together with a notice in substantially the form provided by Section 81.00 of the Local Finance law, in a newspaper having a general circulation in said Village and hereby designated as the official newspaper of said Village for such publication, after the period of time shall have elapsed for the submission and filing of a petition for a permissive referendum and a valid petition shall not have been submitted and filed.

Section 13. The firm Barclay Damon LLP is hereby appointed Bond Counsel of the Village in connection with the bonds and notes herein authorized.

Section 14. Except as provided in the following sentence, this Resolution is adopted subject to a permissive referendum pursuant to Section 36.00 of the Local Finance Law and Article 9 of the Village Law, and the Village Clerk is hereby authorized and directed within ten (10) days after the adoption of this Resolution, to post and publish a notice which sets forth the date of the Resolution's adoption and contains an abstract of this Resolution concisely stating its purpose and effect and indicating that this Resolution is subject to a permissive referendum.
